

Feedbacks in 2024 (excerpts)

1. Was this training beneficial or instructive for you?

- I gained a deeper understanding of the health management of A-Bomb survivors and the effects of radiation on the human body.
- I learned a great deal about the devastating impact of the atomic bomb and how it continues to affect many people.
- I believe it was an excellent training, as I was able to learn about the personal experiences of A-Bomb survivors, as well as the administrative and legal support systems in place for them.
- Through research materials, I gained an understanding of the vast dangers of radiation and the immense time and costs required for recovery.

2. Please explain how you are going to put your newly acquired knowledge or techniques to practical use.

- If I have the opportunity to treat radiation-exposed patients in South Korea, I believe I will be able to provide more detailed understanding and care. I also want to explore building animal models to study the correlation between low-dose radiation exposure and cancer.
- I understood the importance of always being cautious about radiation exposure. I will communicate this to those around me and, if there are areas for improvement in South Korea's disaster response system, I would like to offer my suggestions.
- I think it is important to share more experiences from Japan's DMAT teams and conduct more radiation disaster prevention training. Based on the materials received during the training, I will find ways to apply this knowledge in various aspects of future drills.

3. Please tell us your views on the training, curriculum, period, etc., so that we may improve our program in the future.

- Both the curriculum and the duration were excellent.
- There were some repetitive topics in the lectures, which occasionally caused a loss of focus. Additionally, I would like to learn more detailed information about the current situation of Korean A-Bomb survivors.
- The training on preparing for nuclear disasters was very important. I would have liked to learn more about decontamination and disaster drills.
- It would be beneficial to have training targeted specifically at individuals within the same profession, such as for healthcare professionals only.

(1) Please tell us your impressions of life in Hiroshima.

- The city was clean, the people were kind, and the food was delicious.
- It was impressive to see the effort to continue documenting and researching the history, even after nearly 80 years since the bombing.
- Not only did I learn about the history of Hiroshima and its reconstruction, but I was also able to directly feel the spirit of recovery through the lives of the people, making it a valuable experience.

- I didn't experience any particular inconvenience, but the humidity was challenging.
- Thanks to the efforts of the staff, the training was smooth and comfortable.
